SUNLIGHT CARE PACK

The CSR taskforce of Sunlight REIT took the initiative to source protective and daily necessity items and prepare what we call the "Sunlight Care Pack" for people in need. The pack contains facial masks, hand sanitizer, wet tissues, rice, bottled drink and snacks. Goods were sourced from multiple vendors and our staff volunteered to repack over 7,000 items into 1,000 Sunlight Care Packs, which were then swiftly donated through The Salvation Army and St. James' Settlement. - Disinfection of common facilities are strengthened, especially for toilets, door handles, lift buttons and handrails of escalators

OUR SPECIAL ARRANGEMENT UNDER COVID-19

Health and safety are at the forefront of priorities for any organization. With the spread of COVID-19, Henderson Sunlight has implemented a number of initiatives to ensure that staff stays healthy while providing an environment where they can work efficiently. Below are a few measures which we feel are quite useful and may be suitable for your organization as well.

- Co-working space On top of home office arrangement, the company is renting desk spaces at theDesk located at Strand 50 (formerly called Bonham Trade Centre) in Sheung Wan. This arrangement further split our staff into smaller teams, minimizing the risk of infection. Currently theDesk is running a promotion for all Sunlight REIT tenants. Don't miss out on this opportunity!
- Flexible working hours To protect staff traveling to and from work, working hours have been streamlined so that staff can pick their work commencement at any time from 8:00am to 10:00am, while facial masks are provided on a daily basis.
- Lunch To reduce risks associated with eating together and at restaurants, lunch boxes are offered for all staff at workplace.
 Actually we have been providing lunch to staff since inception, and it's a policy warmly received.

• Technology - Given home office and split team arrangement, IT enhancement including the enabling of remote access is a clear prerequisite. We give special gratitude to our IT colleagues who have worked tirelessly to ensure that staff stationing at various locations can discharge their duties efficiently, without compromising data and system security.

HONG KONG GOVERNMENT ANTI-EPIDEMIC FUND

The Government has launched an Anti-epidemic Fund to address the needs of the community under the outbreak of COVID-19. Some of its measures are briefly highlighted below for your reference:

First phase of Anti-epidemic Fund

| General restaurants, marine restaurants and factory canteens | One-off subsidy of \$200,000 |

| Light refreshment restaurants, fresh provision shops, food factories, bakeries, siu mei and lo mei shops | One-off subsidy of \$80,000 |
| Retailers | One-off subsidy of \$80,000 |
| Public sector schools, Direct Subsidy Scheme schools, private primary, secondary schools and kindergarten | The subsidy rate ranges from \$10,000 to \$ 25,000 per school |

Second phase of Anti-epidemic Fund

| Employment Support Scheme | All employers who have been making Mandatory Provident Fund (MPF) contributions or have set up Occupation Retirement Schemes for employees are eligible. The wage subsidy is calculated based on 50% of the monthly salary, which is capped at \$18,000 for a period of 6 months |

| Private schools | One-off relief grant of \$40,000 |
| Instructors, coaches, trainers and operators of interests classes engaged by schools | One-off relief grant of \$7,500 |
| Licensed individuals of the estate agency sector | One-off cash subsidy equal to the 24-month licence fee of the relevant licences |
| Catering sector | One-off subsidy ranging from \$250,000 to \$2.2 million to catering outlets based on the size of their premises |
| Fitness centre operator | One-off subsidy of \$100,000 |
| Beauty parlour operator | One-off subsidy of \$30,000-\$100,000 depending on the size of the premises, subject to a cap of \$3 million |
| Non-domestic account for water and sewage charges | 75% waiver of water and sewage charges from August to November 2020, subject to a monthly cap of \$20,000 and \$12,500 respectively |
